Prescriptions

With over 10 thousand patients Timaru Medical Centre is very busy with over 100 prescription requests every day.

We endeavour to process the prescriptions in a timely manner, however due to the volume, we require a 24 hour turn around to process these. This has been in place since we opened in Heaton Street in July 2017, however it was not necessarily enforced. If you

require an on the day urgent prescription, this will now cost \$25, non-urgent scripts are still \$15, we still fax or deliver these to the pharmacy of your choice.

If you are on regular medications, you may need to see a GP every three months, it is up to the GP to decide on the frequency of visits. Please remember that if your health is stable and you are on regular medications, you have to be seen every 12 months.
